This Week's Reflection

I read this story a while back and wanted share to it with you:



"As a man was passing the elephants, he suddenly stopped, confused by the fact that these huge creatures were being held by only a small rope tied to their front leg. No chains, no cages. It was obvious that the elephants could, at any time, break away from their bonds but for some reason, they did not. He saw a trainer nearby and asked why these animals just stood there and made no attempt to get away. "Well," the trainer said, "when they are very young and much smaller, we used the same size rope to tie them and, at that age, it's enough to hold them. As they grow up, they are conditioned to believe they cannot break away. They believe the rope can still hold them, so they never try to break free." The man was amazed. These animals could at any time break free from their bonds but because they believed they couldn't, they were stuck right where they were".

The words in this story "they are conditioned to believe that they cannot break away" really stood out to me as we can be the same in our lives. Life can condition us into believing that we can't overcome difficulties or break away from the problems that we face maybe due to failures in the past. As it says in the story the elephants could have broken their bonds with ease, but it was their minds that kept them there.

God even addressed this in the Bible by saying that "as a person thinks in their heart, so they are".

Maybe in the past, some words have been spoken over us that have caused us to be tied to insecurity and low self-esteem. It can even be that we have faced so many battles and feel weary, so we are conditioned to believe that in the future, we will always suffer defeat and failure.
