

Open Academy Newsletter – 6 September 2024

Dear parents, carers and students

Welcome back to all and welcome to new parents to our parent and student newsletter.

As always, we hope you will find it to be filled with important information, celebration and opportunities.

Today we are celebrating, as we have officially become one of the first academies in the country to be redesignated as a Church of England School! Thank you so much to the hundreds of people who responded to surveys and consultations regarding this and with the overwhelming (95+%) in favour, we were very hopeful it would happen.

It was a real shock in November 2022 when Ofsted downgraded us due to a safeguarding technicality, the academy came within a week of being re-brokered to a community school trust with a very different ethos. Obviously, we were delighted when Ofsted returned within 6 months to both validate our safeguarding procedures and regrade the academy as GOOD in all categories. However, we were shocked that we could have lost our distinctly Christian ethos due to one negative judgement from the inspectors. It turned out that, although we were always intended to be a Christian school, without the designation as a Church of England School, that status could be easily lost.

At the time, staff, students and parents alike were concerned about what the change in provider might do to the academy's inclusive approach, so when we began a consultation to be re-designated a Church of England school to protect its ethos and values, we were not at all surprised at the positive outcome and for that we are so grateful.

We have become a beacon of success in inclusive education precisely because we are totally driven by our strong Christian values. We see every child as a blessing and work hard to ensure that students of all faiths and none, are welcomed and supported to success.

So, it is with absolute joy that I can confirm that, yes we are now a Church Of England School, and that there will be no change at all in our ethos, admissions or even our name – we will carry on being the strongly Christian, all faiths and none, inclusive school that we always have been! Thank you.

Now I would love to finish on that high note this week, however I feel I must apologise for the technical problems we have been having. Changing student information management system from SIMS to Arbor and at the same time changing phone and internet provider, all to save money, has meant an absolute perfect IT storm. Not to mention Arbor itself having start of term problems. Please accept my apologies for our communication and organisation problems. All will be sorted by the middle of the next week I have been told.

Further to the technical issues we have been experiencing with Arbor, our new management information system, we have had to delay the rollout of the parental app. As soon as the issues are resolved we will send further communication about this including how to register, please look out for this information and register your child when prompted. Unfortunately, we have had to further delay introducing the changes for payment of school meals. Can we ask that you continue to top up the account for your child's lunch through the current ParentPay platform, until further notice. We are aiming to get the links to access the ParentPay platform for Year 7 and other new students out to parents early next week, we are so sorry for the delays and any inconvenience caused.

Finally, this week I would just like to share that we have a smaller senior leadership team this year and I have cut down to 4 days per week. I am delighted, however, to confirm Miss Wenlock as being Principal on Fridays from now on as she replaces Mr Ward as our full time Vice Principal. Whilst there is much change I am hoping we will very much be back to business as usual from next week!
