Dear parents, carers and students

This week our assemblies have been focussing on our core value of hard work. Where we have been thinking about how hard work also needs to be smart work.

We are frustrated that teething problems in our new IT systems mean that a number of tools we would like to share with you are not quite ready – the obvious one is the TEAMS homework system as this is the most important bit of working smarter.

Along with assessment folder tasks, homework across all subjects is the opportunity that teachers get to see exactly how learning is progressing in their subjects and to develop specific advice for a student's next step in learning.

It may be that the teacher gives a specific written comment, or picks from a statement bank of common next steps, the feedback may be written on assessment or may be given verbally during the subsequent lessons. However, as I have been explaining to students this week, it is taking note of this specific advice and guidance on the work that working harder becomes working smarter.

I have been inspired by the Paralympics recently and I am in awe of the athletes who have taken their challenges and, instead of being restricted, have developed their talents around them, and what talent we have seen. Alfie Hewett has been a great friend to the academy – giving the presentation evening speech a couple of years ago. I am thrilled he has a Paralympics Gold medal this time, but although he lost his singles final, it was for some the most competitive entertaining sport I have watched for many years. Tennis was definitely the winner! It did however leave me thinking how awesome it is that some people work out how to develop their skills and abilities into talents and how the application of hard work can then really pay off. I used the example of Hannah Cockcroft in assembly – 9 Golds over 3 Paralympics – what an example of hard work.

So hopefully you will encourage hard work in our students – make sure homework is taken seriously and that learning can then get smarter – we know all our students have talent – we cannot wait to see it develop!

Finally, this week at the end of assemblies, Mr Dilley has been promoting our student leadership program. It gets bigger every year and with some fantastic rewards it is more than worthwhile getting involved. Applications are out now and form elections will happen at the end of next week. Please do encourage everyone to give it a go, even new Year 7s as, I will be needing Year 7 student leaders to help me with our Year 6 parents evening in just a couple of weeks on Wednesday, 25 September.

I am going to work on keeping my bit a little shorter this year, so I will stop there and encourage you to enjoy the rest of the newsletter


## 5. PE

# **Football & Gymnastics**




