

# Open Academy Newsletter – 20 September 2024

Dear parents, carers and students

Welcome to this week's newsletter.

This week it is just a brief thank you and well done for your efforts to come back on top form. The vast majority of students – well over 98% arrive in full correct uniform every morning and although a few need reminders throughout the day, the vast majority wear their uniform with pride as their 'professional dress code' for the day's work.

I have noticed, however, that around Year 9 some students do seem to struggle to keep their shirts tucked in (if I had £1 for every time I say "tuck your shirt in..." we would not be struggling to balance our budget). I therefore wonder whether for some, especially boys, if they might need a belt to help keep their trousers up!

The vast majority of students have got down to lessons well too and our attendance is much closer to prepandemic normal levels, at around 95% attendance. A couple of year groups are still getting up to speed. Year 10 and Year 11 have a small number of students that we are working hard to ensure are attending regularly. This is vital if we are to support students to get the best grades they can for their GCSEs, not to mention the benefits of school attendance for student's mental health and well-being. If you or your child are struggling to ensure good attendance, please do talk to us – whatever the issue we will work with you to manage it.

It is vital that whilst students are off sick for any reason, that they are keeping up with work as best as they can. We are working hard to ensure Classnotes are up to date with current lessons, although I know we have had a few technical difficulties as the term has started. At KS3 knowledge organisers are always available on the website, but students in all years should have plenty of homework to get on with even if Classnotes is unavailable.

Homework is another area to celebrate at the start of term. Although our TEAMs system has been a challenge to update and is still teething at the moment, staff are well in the habit of setting regular homework now, so students are developing the habit of getting it done. We know around 80-85% of students complete their homework first time without being chased and that figure is improving all the time. Please help us keep this up – we know how much better students will achieve as they commit to their subject work at home.

This year, we are going back to an earlier 'mock exam' season for Year 11 with PPE1 to be held in November – that pretty much means starting to revise from now on. This is so that the reality check that inevitably follows mock results can happen early enough in the year for students to be able to improve their grade before the real thing.

Our open evenings are rapidly approaching – next week for Year 6 and two weeks later the 6<sup>th</sup> Form OA6 evening where we will be launching our new OA6 Pathways approach to study programs which we think might be very appealing to our Year 11s. Given the early mock season, we will also use this for our Year 11 study skills event which is always very well attended and our most popular parent partnership event, often with 90%+ parent attendance as we run a variety of sessions to help parents explore the key aspects of supporting children through their final GCSE year. So Year 11 parents please do mark the date of Wednesday, 2 October for both the study skills evening (from 5.00-6.00pm) and OA6 open evening (from 6.00-7.30).
