Dear parents, carers and students, welcome to the newsletter this week.

There is always so much going on at the academy – from a visit this week from a dozen or so head teachers from Kazakhstan visiting Britain to explore best practice in academy management, to our annual Alumni celebration and certificate evening last night. where we welcomed back the class of '24 to celebrate their achievements and present them with their well-deserved awards and certificates.

The highlight of my week by far, however was the moment of sombre remembrance shared across the academy as the bugler played the last post at 11.00am on Monday and the whole academy fell silent for two minutes to honour the sacrifice made by all our brave service people over the years to defend our freedoms.

We were humbled to welcome back Mr Gavin Scott, shipmate and friend of one of the fallen – our own Frank Armes who lost his life on HMS Coventry during the Falklands conflict. Our Open Ark room is dedicated to Frank's memory and we are always so pleased to have representation from the services associations. Frank's family and friends and representatives of the 809 Squadron, whose ceremonial lifebuoy from HMS Ark Royal hangs proudly on our wall, and is where we lay our wreaths during the service of remembrance.

Students from the full range of cadet forces provided the first welcome line as our visitors arrived for the service, then over 70 student leaders formed a guard of honour to escort the visitors from the ground floor up to the Open Ark where a remembrance service was held before the whole academy assembled for the silence. Our visitors were incredibly impressed by the solemnity and respect shown by the whole school, as I am delighted to say that throughout the 2-minute silence, you could hear a pin drop in the academy.

We look forward to May when we will hold a further remembrance event specifically to mark the 44th anniversary of Frank's loss and I have no doubt that another special moment in the life of the Academy will be shared.

The Kazakhstani headteachers – together responsible for over 25000 students in their schools were impressed by our building, our approach to education and our students – particularly a Year 11 who acted as unofficial translator for their tour of the academy. It was great to share our culture and to hear about theirs and was another moment to celebrate.

The Alumni event which saw us welcome the Norwich City legend Darren Huckerby would probably be many of our communities highlight though. During a wonderful ceremony that saw certificates trophies and awards given out to so many deserving students, the amazing Mrs Halliday who organised the event, conducted a great interview of this local household name and we were treated to his thoughts and views on an amazing career.

As I said at the start there is always so much going on, but whichever was the highlight for your child, and it may have been our community assemblies from the police or Mr Pimlott's assemblies on remembrance, maybe even a moment of calm for a student in my mindfulness form, there were many things happening in the academy this week to lift our winter spirits. I can't wait for next week!



Payment Plan - To spread the cost of camp, you may pay in instalments between now and 2 May 2025. The £30.00 deposit payment was due by 22 October. All payments need to be made through Parent Pay, which has been set up for all students in Year 7.

- Late Minutes We continue to focus on reducing the number of times students are late to lessons this is all time away from important learning, and we need to ensure all students are where they need to be, at the start of each and every lesson. We would like to remind you that all late minutes will be added up throughout the week and given to tutors to inform the relevant students on a Friday morning. - **Seneca** Just a little note regarding Seneca. The students have all been auto-registered for Seneca using their school email address. In order to log in and access their homework they need to go onto www.senecalearning.com and click login on the right hand side of the page. They will then be prompted to this screen:



The student then needs to click on the continue with Microsoft button and login with their school account. If the student completes homework in hub on a school computer this should log in automatically.

Science Camp is a non-residential structured programme open to Year 10 students selected by application. It incorporates practical laboratory activities, networking sessions and individual work placements across the institutes. The scheme is run by the John Innes Centre in response to the large number of enquiries we receive regarding Year 10 work experience placements. We aim to inspire the scientists of the future and provide them with the chance to meet and work with world class scientists at the Norwich Research Park. NCH&C are pleased to announce applications are open for **Years 10-13** five-day work experience programme to be held in July 2025!

This new five-day classroom-based programme will take place from 7-11 July 2025 in Norwich. It offers an overview of NHS clinical professions which may include nursing, physiotherapy, children's services, psychology, pharmacy, speech and language therapy, podiatry, and occupational therapy. You will receive visits from different professions with interactive presentations, including a clinical visit to a service of your choice on Day 4. This is a nursing and therapy led programme with interaction from highly specialist services, rather than a purely medicine-based work experience.
